

NEW WORDS, DEEPER MEANING, SAME MASS: Last week, we mentioned that the new English translation of the New Roman Missal would be implemented in the Archdiocese of Montreal in Advent 2011. (Date may be postponed to Lent 2012.) Again, the changes to be implemented *do not* affect the order and structure of the Mass, but we can expect changes in the wording of prayers and responses. To prepare for these changes, we will be offering three evenings of presentations on

the new Roman Missal this coming Lent. You will have an opportunity to look at some of the changes in the liturgy, for example, the new music and the people's responses and prayers, such as the Gloria, Creed, and Holy, Holy. The hope of the bishops throughout the English-speaking world is that everyone - priests and people - will be ready to pray with new words, mindful that we are celebrating the same Mass, encountering and receiving the same Lord, but with a new appreciation for, and deeper understanding of, what it is we do when we celebrate the Mass. More information will be included in upcoming bulletins. Stay tuned!

BLESSING OF THROATS: The Feast of St. Blaise falls on **Thursday, Feb 3**; we will be blessing throats following Mass that day. The Church has traditionally blessed throats on this day recalling the event when St. Blaise cured a boy who was choking on a fish bone.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK is meant to strengthen those who are seriously ill. Many mistakenly think of this Sacrament as "Last Rites." That is more Hollywood than reality. The Church's teaching is that the Anointing of the Sick is for everyone who is "in danger of death" from sickness or old age. Most serious illnesses and any surgery that requires general anesthetic put us "in danger of death." The anointing of the sick will be celebrated after all Masses at Becket, **the weekend of February 5/6.**

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION: **February 4** is the First Friday of the month. After Mass, you are invited to join us for an hour between 9:00 a.m. and midnight for exposition and adoration of the Holy Eucharist. Please sign up in the book at the back of the church.

WORD OF THE WEEK - PARTS OF THE

MASS: From the Introductory Rites to Concluding Rites, the Mass follows a "fundamental structure which has been preserved throughout the centuries down to our own day" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1346). Though the Mass is one unified act of worship, it consists of many parts, each with its own purpose and meaning. For example, the *epiclesis* is

the prayer petitioning the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify offerings of bread and wine so that they may become the Body and Blood of Christ.
