ARE WE FIGHTING THE RIGHT WAR? Even though Advent is marked in this country by millions of Catholics, Lutherans, Episcopalians and many other Christians, it's almost invisible in media coverage and cultural celebrations. Advent has become a profit-seeking period for retailers who would have us believe that the Christmas season begins in early fall or even late summer, as they exploit the themes of generosity and hospitality, and turn Advent into a frenzied orgy of consumerism, in anticipation of upcoming gift-exchange extravaganza - that "ends" on December 25. Even Advent calendars feature snow scenes or reminders that Santa is on his way, but rarely reflect religious themes. The war is not on Christmas, but on Advent. It is sad that Christians have become unwitting captives to this consumerism, demanding that this 'season' of overconsumption be done in Christ's name alone. As liturgical Christians, let us begin our Advent journey next weekend as a penitential time of preparation, reflection and prayer, as we wait, in joyful hope, for the celebration of the birth of Our Lord and the promise of His second coming.

The Christmas season begins on December 25 and continues for 12 days. May God grant you a blessed, and fruitful Advent Season!
