

## HOSPITALS AND PRIVACY LAWS

Because of privacy laws, hospitals do not notify us when parishioners are admitted. If someone in your family is admitted to hospital and you want the parish office to know, please call and tell us. With upwards of 1,000 people at Mass most weekends, we don't always notice if someone is missing, or whether they are travelling or have moved out of the parish. Many hospitals, Catholic or not, have a priest assigned to visit the Catholic patients and bring them Communion, but the family must tell the admittance office of their wish for a clergy visit. Our priests are always happy to visit the sick to administer the sacraments or just chat, and we have a team of laity who bring Holy Communion to the sick.

## HERE'S A QUESTION ON THE EUCHARISTIC FAST



How long do we need to fast before receiving Holy Communion at Mass? St. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord with fasting and penance, because fasting makes room in the heart, mind, body and soul for the Lord. We fast before Holy Communion for the same reason: to prepare the way for the Lord; to make room for Him; to "clean house." The Eucharistic fast promotes a deeper reverence and respect for this wonderful sacrament, which is not ordinary food; it is the panis angelorum, the "bread of angels." The human body and soul are so closely connected that the soul is prepared for a more fruitful reception of the Blessed Sacrament when the body is denied the comfort and satisfaction of eating or drinking. The one-hour fast increases mental alertness and fosters a deeper hunger in the soul to become united with Our Lord. The Code of Canon Law states: "Whoever is to receive the blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine" (Canon 919.1). This discipline does not apply to the sick and elderly. "The elderly and those who are suffering from some illness, as well as those who care for them, may receive the blessed Eucharist even if within the preceding hour they have consumed something" (Canon 919.3).



## ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA, JUNE 13



Saint Anthony of Padua was born in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195, into a noble and religious family. A short, chubby man, St. Anthony was a profound theologian. Anthony's life-long desire was to bring Muslims to Christianity. At about the age of 25, St. Anthony set sail to begin his ministry, but fell ill shortly after arriving in Morocco and was forced to return home to heal; however, his ship was blown off course and St. Anthony landed in Sicily. It was there that he discovered that he was also a brilliant preacher. Combining his skills with the gift of miracles, St. Anthony converted many heretics, rich and poor, common and noble, to the faith, and was given the title

"Hammer of the Heretics". Many miracles have been attributed to St. Anthony, most of them taking place in Padua (and thus his name). Saint Anthony of Padua is venerated today as one of the greatest Franciscan Saints. He is the patron saint of barren women, lost articles, the poor and travellers. He died June 13, 1231, and was canonized just a year later.
