FEAST OF THE ARCHANGELS: SEPTEMBER 29



The word 'angel' denotes a function (messenger) rather than a nature. Those who deliver messages of supreme importance are called archangels.

Archangels are the only "named" angels in all of scripture. Michael (whose name means "Who is like God?") appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who

defends Israel against its enemies; in the Book of Revelation, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the 4th century, and in the West in the 5th.

Gabriel ("Strength of God") also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. Gabriel announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary the birth of Jesus. His greeting, "Hail, full of grace," is the basis of our Rosary prayers.

Raphael's ("Medicine of God") activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he guides Tobit's son Tobias through a series of fantastic adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending: Tobias's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness and the restoration of the family fortune.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that "The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls 'angels' is a truth of faith. The witness of Scripture is as clear as the unanimity of Tradition." Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or messenger of God. They are celestial or heavenly beings, on a higher order than human beings. An angel has no body and does not depend on matter for his existence or activity. They are distinct from saints, which men can become. Angels have intellect and will, and are immortal. They are a vast multitude, but each is an individual person. Archangels are one of the nine choirs of angels listed in the Bible. In ascending order, the choirs or classes are 1) Angels, 2) Archangels, 3) Principalities, 4) Powers, 5) Virtues, 6) Dominations, 7) Thrones, 8) Cherubim and 9) Seraphim.

Saint Michael the archangel, defend us in this day of battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all evil spirits who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls.

There will be a special Mass to celebrate this feast on Saturday, September 29, at 11:00 a.m. in the church.

When selfishness prevents us from reaching out to others, teach us your art of selflessness.


Stay with us, Lord, and help us to remember that the royal road of the cross is the only way for us and for the Church.
