LIGHTING OF THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE



The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the second week. After the prayer, the oldest child lights the first and second purple candles.

Leader: O Lord, stir up our hearts that we may prepare for Thy only begotten Son, that through His coming we may be made worthy to serve Thee with pure minds. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The two candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the second week.

WHAT IS THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION?



The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary falls this year on Thursday, December 8.

When declaring this doctrine as dogma in 1854, Pope Pius IX, professed, "The Most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of Almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin," committed by Adam and Eve, which we all carry before baptism. Mary, because of her participation in the plan of salvation, was saved from original sin at the time of her conception in the womb of her mother St. Anne (Jesus' grandmother). God chose to bestow on Mary special graces, understandable and proper for the Mother of God.



Beyond the Birds and the Bees: Raising Sexually Whole and Holy Kids by Greg and Lisa Popcak



How can you have "the talk" so that your kids will listen? All it takes is a little Respect. Realize what they need to know and when they need to know it. Control your temper and the temptation to lecture. Teach your children what the gift of the body is really for. HERE'S A QUESTION

Christ said "Call no man on earth your father; for one is your Father, who is in heaven." But we call Catholic priests "Father": is that wrong?

If you look at the context of this quote you will see that Jesus is criticizing the hypocritical behaviour of the Scribes and Pharisees (Mt 23:2-12). Does this mean then that we cannot call anyone "Father"? Not at all: see Acts 7:2, 22:1, Lk 16:24; and an explicit text in 1Cor 4:14-16: "I am writing you this not to shame you, but to admonish you as my beloved children. Even if you should have countless guides to Christ, yet you do not have many fathers, for I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel." If we were to take a superficial literal interpretation of the verse you refer to, then you should not even call your biological father a "father." What Jesus is saying here, using the typical hyperbole of the time that was common among the Rabbinical teachers, is that instead of putting themselves above others and seeking titles and glory, the religious leaders should place themselves at the service of others. "I have come not to be served but to serve," Jesus said, which is how we should interpret what he says about titles.
