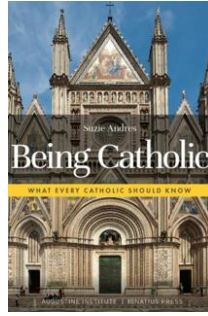

HAVE YOU MADE YOUR FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS?



Pre-arrangement at the funeral home is often a good idea. However, the Archdiocese does *not* permit funeral Masses in a funeral home (notwithstanding what some homes will tell you). The parish church is the normal place for a Catholic funeral. While Catholics are permitted to be cremated, we recommend that cremation not take place until after

the funeral Mass. In any case, be sure to let a loved one know your precise wishes and write them down where they can be easily located upon your death (often the will is not read until *after* the funeral). Many devout Catholics are now deprived of a funeral Mass because non-practising relatives choose other options. Our priests are always available for advice or assistance in these matters.
