In 2006, Development and Peace campaigned vigorously for corporate social responsibility and accountability of the mining industry in

developing countries. Our efforts resulted in the adoption of Bill C-300 in the House of Commons, which is now referred to the Standing Committee for Foreign Affairs and International Development. If it passes scrutiny there, Bill C-300 will be sent on to the Senate for ratification.

In 2007, Development and Peace focused its campaign on establishing a mining ombudsman, to give a voice to the communities in developing nations that are adversely affected by Canadian mining operations. To this end, MP Bernard Patry presented Motion 383, and in March 2009, MP Francis Scarpaleggia supported the motion with a speech. However the Canadian government responded by creating a token “Corporate Social Responsibility Counsellor” position without the mandate and power of an ombudsman. **So, we must continue to make our voices heard!** Learn more - visit www.devp.org.
