**PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL AGM AND ELECTIONS** will be held on **October 25 after the 11:00 a.m. Mass.** The Pastoral Council plays a *consultative* role and functions as an advisory board to the Pastor by studying and reflecting on parish issues (worship, education, evangelization, stewardship, etc.) and then recommending conclusions. We pray and work together to discern the will of God on how best to serve the parish. Elected PPC members serve one, two or three-year terms on a rotational basis. Four three-year-terms and one one-year term must be filled at the AGM on **October 25.** If you would like to engage in pastoral planning, developing pastoral priorities and goals that help fulfill the ministry of the parish, please consider running for a position on our council. If you do not want to run for a position, please come to the AGM and vote for the persons you feel would best represent your pastoral needs. Nomination forms available at the back of the church.
