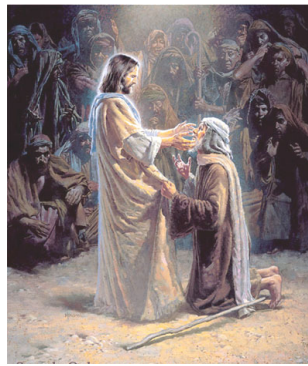

LOW-GLUTEN ALTAR BREADS FOR CELIACS: Please note that all Celiacs may receive the Body Of Christ at every Mass at Becket in the form of low-gluten hosts. These special hosts are made according to the requirements of both the Code of Canon Law (c.924) and the special considerations set out by the Prefect for the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith and may be validly used at Mass. Our low gluten bread is made with wheat starch and water. The gluten content is 0.01%. These hosts are made, shipped, and stored in a dedicated gluten-free environment. Please proceed to the tabernacle during the distribution of Holy Communion to receive a low-gluten host.
