Children: Does it bother me when another child takes the glory for something I did? How do I react in those situations?

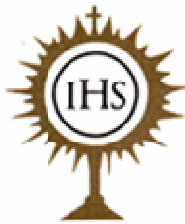

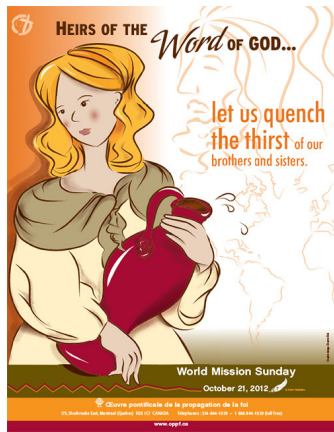
