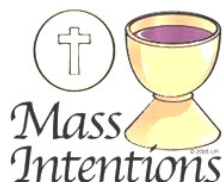

UNANNOUNCED MASS INTENTIONS: In addition to our "announced" Masses (published in the bulletin, website, and announced at Mass), we also offer unannounced Masses. Unannounced Mass intentions are given to priests outside our parish, often retired priests. An unannounced Mass does not include a time or date as it is to be celebrated by the priest at his earliest convenience. The stipend for an unannounced Mass is \$5. Unannounced Masses may be arranged in exactly the same way as an announced Mass, by contacting the parish office.
