

ST. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN



John Henry Cardinal Newman was one of the most influential English Catholics of the 19th century. He journeyed from Anglicanism to Catholicism and used his great intellect and masterful writing ability to win over thousands of people to Christ and the Roman Catholic Church. Newman was born in 1801, into an Anglican family. From an early age he had a passion for God, having experienced his “first conversion,” at 15. He was ordained an Anglican minister in 1825. After founding Oxford Movement, he was led to become a

Catholic in 1845, was ordained a priest in 1848, and founded the Oratory of St Philip Neri. Many of Newman’s friends broke off relations with him after his conversion, and his family kept him at a distance. He had to resign his teaching fellowship and lost his only source of income. Newman said that the one thing that sustained him during this trying period was Christ’s presence in the Blessed Sacrament. In 1851 he became first rector of a Catholic university in Ireland. He is today the patron of university Catholic chaplaincies around the world known as “Newman Centres” (Montreal has one at McGill). He was named a Cardinal in 1879, and died in 1890.

WORDS OF WISDOM OF ST. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

“God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission—I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his. I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for nothing. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

“Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers, He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me—still He knows what He is about.”

PRAYER OF CARDINAL NEWMAN

Dear Jesus, help me to spread Your fragrance everywhere I go.

Flood my soul with Your Spirit and Life.

Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly

that my life may only be a radiance of Yours. Shine through me and be so in me, that every soul I come in contact with may feel Your presence in my soul.

Let them look up and see no longer me but only Jesus!

Stay with me and then I shall begin to shine as You shine, so to shine as to be a light to others.

The light, O Jesus, will be all from You; none of it will be mine.

It will be You, shining on others through me.

Let me thus praise You in the way which You love best, by shining on those around me.

Let me preach You without preaching, not by my words but by my example, by the catching force, the sympathetic influence of what I do, the evident fullness of the love my heart bears for You.




OKTOBERFEST FUNDRAISER:
