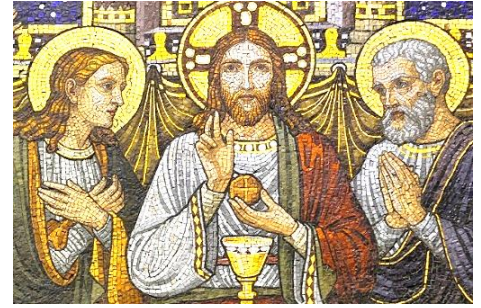

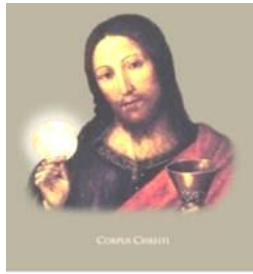

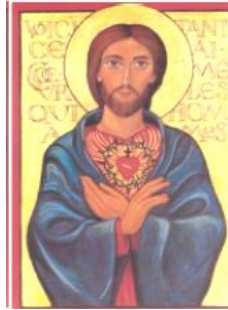
THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (*Corpus Christi*)



“The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates *the heart of the mystery of the Church*. In a variety of ways she joyfully experiences the constant fulfilment of the promise: “Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age” (*Mt 28:20*), but in the Holy Eucharist, through the changing of bread and wine into the body and blood of the Lord, she rejoices in this presence with unique intensity. Ever since Pentecost, when the Church, the

People of the New Covenant, began her pilgrim journey towards her heavenly homeland, the Divine Sacrament has continued to mark the passing of her days, filling them with confident hope.” ~ *Pope St. John Paul II*

SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART: FRIDAY, JUNE 11



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is the oldest devotion in the Catholic Church. Its origins are found the St. John's Gospel, written before the year 100. "When they came to Jesus, they found he was already dead, and so instead of breaking his legs one of the soldiers pierced his side with an lance; and immediately there blood and water flowed out." (John 19:34) The blood and water flowing from Christ's side symbolize his love for humanity. The Sacred Heart devotion became popular in the last half of the 17th century, largely thanks to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French nun, to

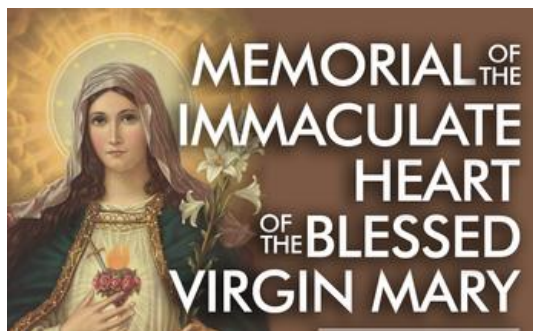
whom Jesus appeared a number of times. During his first apparition in 1673, Jesus said, "My divine heart is so full of love for all people, and for you in particular, that it is unable to contain within itself the flames of its burning love." In a later apparition, he revealed the 12 Promises for those who practice devotion to the Sacred Heart. St. Margaret Mary dedicated the rest of her life to spreading this devotion. The Jesuits furthered her efforts with the Apostleship of Prayer in 1844, which encourages spiritual growth through recitation of the Morning Offering, personal consecration to the Sacred Heart, display of a Sacred Heart picture in one's home, and attendance at Mass on the First Friday of every month. In 1856, the Catholic Church established the Feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated annually on the second Friday after Pentecost.

Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests

This feast of the humanity of God incarnate, was chosen by Rome as a special annual day of prayer for the sanctification of priests. It reveals to us the very heart of Jesus, beating with love for all people of all times. Priests are called to listen to that heartbeat and become ‘other Christs’ among God’s people. They say that if you want better priests, pray for the ones you have:

People around the world are being encouraged to stop whatever they are doing at 3pm local time and spend a quiet moment praying in thanksgiving for our priests and contemplating the gift of priesthood. Set your cell phone alarm for 3pm.

“Divine Savior, Jesus Christ, who has entrusted the whole work of your redemption, the welfare and salvation of the world, to priests as your representatives, I offer you through the hands of your most Holy Mother Mary, this present day, whole and entire, with all its prayers, works, and sacrifices, its joys and sorrows, for the sanctification of your priests, and for all those preparing for the priesthood. Give us truly holy priests, inflamed with the fire of your divine love, who seek nothing but your greater glory, and the salvation of souls. And you, Mary, good Mother of priests, protect all priests from dangers to their holy vocation, and with the loving hand of a mother, lead back to the Good Shepherd those unfortunate priests who, unfaithful to their exalted vocation, have gone astray. Amen.”

We give you thanks for this most precious gift as we adore your Real Presence and welcome you into our lives in Holy Communion.

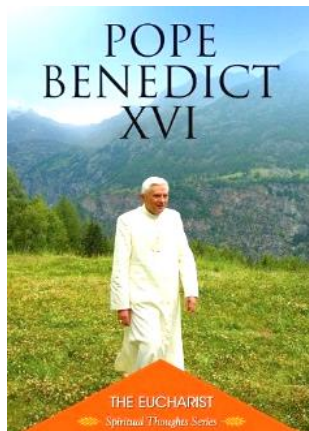
May our communion with you in the Eucharist inspire us to give generously of ourselves in love to our brothers and sisters.
