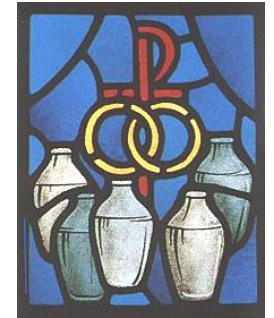

ST. ANTHONY OF EGYPT - January 17



St. Anthony is generally considered to be the founder and father of organized Christian monasticism, although he himself preferred to live the life of a true hermit, apart from any community, in the deserts of Egypt. He was born in the mid-3rd century and died 105 years later. Having lost his parents, and attending church one day, he heard –as if for the first time– Jesus' exhortation to another rich young man in the Biblical narrative: “If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” Anthony told his disciples in later years,

that it was as though Christ has spoken those words to him directly, and so he immediately distributed all his wealth to the poor, and retreated to the solitude of Thebes in Egypt, where he led an ascetic life. He worked to strengthen the action of the Church during the persecution of Emperor Diocletian, supported the 4th-century Church Father St. Athanasius against the heretical Arians, and gathered many disciples. St. Athanasius' “Life of St. Anthony of Egypt” is a moving account of the Anthony's life and legacy, and the spiritual warfare he experienced in the desert.

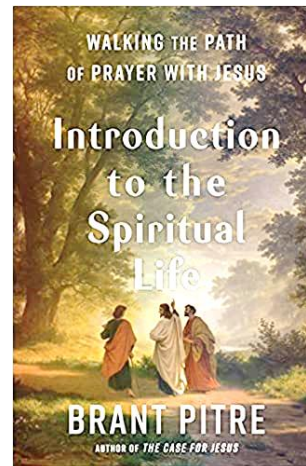

Introduction to the Spiritual Life: Walking the Path of Prayer with Jesus by Brant Pitre
