THE BEHEADING OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST



Shortly after he had baptized Jesus, John the Baptist began to denounce Herod Antipas, the tetrarch of Galilee, who had divorced his own wife and taken Herodias, the wife of his half-brother Philip and also his own niece. John the Baptist declared, "It is not lawful for you to have her," so Herod threw him into prison. Not only did Herod fear John and his disciples, he also knew him to be a righteous man, so he did not kill him. Herodias determined to bring

about John's death. From prison John followed Jesus's ministry, and sent messengers to question him (Lk 7:19-29). One day Herod gave a fine banquet to celebrate his birthday. His entire court was present. Herodias's daughter Salome so pleased Herod when she danced to entertain the company that he promised her whatever she would ask--even half his kingdom. Salome asked her mother for counsel and was told to request the head of the Baptist (Mt 14:1-12). Because of his pride Herod would not decline the request; as St. Augustine says, "an oath rashly taken was criminally kept." He sent a soldier of the guard to behead John in prison, and the "voice crying in the wilderness" was silenced. The head was placed on a platter and taken to Salome, who gave it to her mother. When John's disciples heard what had happened, they took away his body and laid it in a tomb. His cultus is ancient in both the East and West, because intercession to Saint John was believed aid the coming of Christ in the soul, just as it was in history. St. John's Martyrdom is commemorated on August 29.

From Trusting God in the Present by Fr. Jacques Philippe

Every trial is a trial of faith. If I am a believer and I am going through a difficult time, I will unavoidably ask myself at some stage, "What is God doing in all of this? Does he really love me? Is he present in what I am living through?" No matter whether it's sickness, unemployment, or something else, trust in God is put to the test, called into question, and to that question, we always give, consciously or unconsciously, some answer. We may doubt God's love, we may accuse him of abandoning us, we may rebel against him. These things often happen. However, it is possible—and this is beautiful and constructive—to see this time of trial as a call: a call to have a more determined, mature, and adult faith. The specific question we are faced with—What is God doing? Is he really faithful? Can he draw good out of what is happening?—is simply a question of faith. We are invited to respond by deciding to have faith: "I believe! I continue to trust God! Even though I can't see, even though I don't feel anything, even though appearances are against it, I decide to believe. I will believe that God is faithful, that he will not let me fall, that he can draw something positive out of everything that is happening to me."
