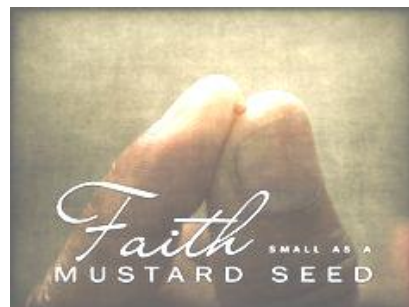

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY COLLECTION - OCTOBER 19

World Mission Sunday stands as a powerful testament to our shared Catholic identity. Held annually on the second to last Sunday of October, this special day unites Catholics across continents in a singular purpose: supporting the Church where it faces its greatest challenges. Instituted by Pope Pius XI nearly a century ago, this collection remains unique as the only worldwide effort directly helping 1,124 poorest mission territories in the world.



“Even today, there are many settings in which the Christian faith is considered absurd, meant for the weak and unintelligent. Settings where other securities are preferred, like technology, money, success, power, or pleasure.

These are contexts where it is not easy to preach the Gospel and bear witness to its truth, where believers are mocked, opposed, despised or at best tolerated and pitied. Yet, precisely for this reason, they are the places where our missionary outreach is desperately needed. A lack of faith is often tragically accompanied by the loss of meaning in life, the neglect of mercy, appalling violations of human dignity, the crisis of the family and so many other wounds that afflict our society.”

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY, and the feast of Our



Lady of the Rosary falls on October 7, the anniversary of the Battle of Lepanto, when the victory of the Christian powers was attributed to the fervent prayers offered to Our Lady. The Battle of Lepanto saw an invading Turkish

army miraculously defeated in Greece after Pope St. Pius V called the faithful to pray the Rosary for the protection of Europe. The history of modern Europe would have been very different but for that victory.

The Rosary is, of course, about more than this. Counting one's prayers beads is a very ancient form of praying, found in India and throughout the Muslim world. Records show that the repetition of the Hail Mary on the beads of the Rosary goes back to the 12th century. Around the year 1328, a treatise named Rosarius refers to Saint Dominic as the promulgator.

The Rosary is a Christ-centered prayer. It is an immersion in the joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious mysteries of His life as retold in the Gospel and the Scriptures. St Bernard said: It is right to meditate on these truths of the life of Christ and I thought it right to recall the abundant sweetness given by the fruits of this priestly root. Mary, drawing abundantly from heaven, has caused this sweetness to overflow. By meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, we are able to draw near to Mary and with her to recall the mysteries of our redemption. The Rosary is thus a powerful weapon in the spiritual warfare that every Christian must in some way face.
