# ALL SOULS DAY COMMEMMORATION - NOVEMBER 1 & 2:



The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed will be celebrated at our parish on Saturday Nov 1, at 4:30 pm and Sunday, November 2, at 9:00 am and 11:00 am. All parishioners, families and friends are welcome to join us, and are invited to bring a photo of their deceased loved one(s) to be placed below the altar during the Mass.

# BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD:

All are invited to inscribe the name(s) of their deceased loved ones in our Book of the Names of the Dead, which will be available at the back of the church November 1. If you have inscribed a name (or names) in the past, it is not necessary to add them again. Every year on November 2, we will honor and remember in prayer all the

souls listed in this book. The book will remain available throughout the month of November.

# WHAT IS ALL SOULS' DAY AND WHY DO WE CELEBRATE IT?

If Jesus' Resurrection taught us anything, it's that love transcends death. Though death physically separates us from our loved ones, our memory and love for them endure. As humans, we constantly seek ways to honor the deceased long after they are gone. Each year, the Catholic Church dedicates a special feast day—All Souls' Day—to remember and pray for all the faithful departed, especially for those believed to be undergoing purification in Purgatory as they await their heavenly reward.

# The Origin of the Feast

The tradition of observing a day for the dead dates back to the early 11<sup>th</sup> century. According to legend, a pilgrim living in the Burgundy region of France claimed to have had a vision of souls in Purgatory enduring the pain of purification. The pilgrim approached Father Odilo of Cluny in the Burgundy region of France, to ask if a special day of prayer could be set aside to commemorate the deceased.

In response, Father Odilo, instituted All Souls' Day on November 2<sup>nd</sup> to be observed by his monastic community with alms, prayers, and sacrifices for the relief of the suffering souls. He also decreed that those requesting a Mass for the departed should make a monetary offering for the poor, thus linking almsgiving with fasting and prayer.

It was soon adopted throughout the Western Church, often with the monks offering prayers and singing the Office of the Dead for the Holy Souls. Shortly thereafter, the Benedictines and Carthusians adopted the practice, and the wider Church followed, formally observing the Feast of All Souls on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

All Souls' Day and All Saints' Day

All Souls' Day immediately follows All Saints' Day (November 1st), a feast during which the Church celebrates all the faithful who share in the full glory of heaven—the official saints and the un-canonized martyrs.

These two closely connected days remind us to be inspired by the saints and to strive for sainthood ourselves. At the same time, they encourage us to trust in God's abundant mercy and his great desire for us to be with him in eternity

# Prayer for the Deceased

In your hands, O Lord, we humbly entrust our brothers and sisters. In this life you embraced them with your tender love; deliver them now from every evil and bid them eternal rest.

The old order has passed away:
welcome them into paradise,
where there will be no sorrow, no weeping or pain,
but fullness of peace and joy
with your Son and the Holy Spirit
forever and ever.
