ST. JOHN LATERAN: WHY DO WE HAVE A FEAST DAY FOR A BUILDING?



Christians first met in homes to hear Jesus' teachings and to celebrate the Eucharist. When the Christians were no longer persecuted for their faith, they built beautiful churches. In the third century, the Laterani family, built a palace which eventually became the property of the Emperor Constantine.

Constantine had recognized Christianity as the religion of the empire, and he donated the palace to the Church. It was

given the title Basilica of the Savior, but later was dedicated to John the Baptist and called St. John Lateran.

St. John Lateran was the home of the popes, the center of the Catholic world for many years. Twenty-eight popes are buried there. Although our pope now lives at the Vatican and presides at St. Peter's basilica, St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, not the Basilica of St. Peter as so many mistakenly believe.

The dedication of this basilica is a happy occasion for the Church because it reminds us of our beginnings, our unity. It stands as a monument to God and all that God does through the Church. The Lateran is today the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome.

All cathedrals celebrate their dedication as a solemnity, but St. John Lateran is unique because it is both a cathedral and a basilica. The Church celebrates the anniversary of the dedication as a cathedral since it is regarded as the Mother Church of the entire Catholic Faith. Because the Church/Cathedral bears the title of "Christ our Savior Cathedral," today's feast is considered a Feast of the Lord which takes precedence over the Sunday liturgy.

VIVA REUNION WYD MTL - 21 NOV 2025


